CHARACTERS are the committee members:

- GEORGIA
- SUSAN
- DEREK
- JOHN

SETTING: Committee meeting room. Big table with everyone sitting at chairs around it.

APPROXIMATE DURATION: 17 minutes

ZOOM OUT - Audition Script

GEORGIA: Excellent. Sounds like a plan. Now, for the parade. Who's going to

co-ordinate that? Susan?

SUSAN: Alright.

GEORGIA: Terrific. Although, Susan, next time you need to get from one end of

the street to the other during the parade, can I suggest that you don't catch the historic tram and instead either wait, or catch the

bus?

SUSAN: I didn't realise it was in the parade.

GEORGIA: The streamers didn't give that away?

SUSAN: No.

GEORGIA: Or the throngs of people lining the street waving at you?

SUSAN: I thought they were being friendly.

DEREK: Your shopping bags were a nice touch.

SUSAN: They were heavy! Woollies had discounted their potatoes, so I

decided to stock up. I couldn't leave them behind.

JOHN: You probably should have sat down in one of the seats rather than
